Hearing/Vision Screenings:

The Marquette County Health Department will be providing vision and hearing screenings for students of Negaunee School District. This will begin on our first day of school, upon returning from Winter Break and continue throughout the month of January. The purpose of the hearing screening is to identify hearing loss. A hearing problem can affect a child's behavior or performance in the classroom. Your child may be referred to an Otology Clinic to be screened by a medical hearing specialist if he/she fails the preliminary and threshold screening. The Michigan Department of Public Health and Marquette County Health Dept share this cost. Any further treatment costs or follow-up care will be the family's responsibility. Grades Kindergarten, Second and Fourth will be screened for hearing. The school will contact you if any referrals are made based on your child's screening.

Many children enter school with eye problems and do not know they see differently. Throughout the growing years, the eye changes as often as clothes sizes. Early identification of an eye problem is important, since most eye conditions are easy to correct. The vision-screening program helps thousands of children in Michigan by periodic screening and advising parents when there is a need for follow-up care. Therefore, Grades First, Third, Fifth, Seventh and Ninth will have the vision screening. You will be contacted if a referral is made based on your child's screening, follow-up will be the family's responsibility.
