


Lakeview Elementary School: 475-7803

GFS - If you shop at GFS, make sure you have signed up for a "Fun Funds" card and present it every time you shop. This helps the LPTP raise additional funds for projects throughout the year;

When: Friday, October 8, 2010

Where/Time:

Lakeview Elementary 2:30-4:00 Cafeteria

Middle School 12:30-2:00 Cafeteria

Who: Recommended for everyone, including people with chronic illness, i.e. asthma, diabetes, heart conditions or anyone living with an infant or an elderly relative.

This year the flu shot will be combined with the seasonal and H1N1 flu. The cost of the vaccine will only be \$8 for students and \$25 for adults.

Permission slips are located in the front office. Students must have a permission slip signed in order to receive the vaccine and make payment at the time of the clinic.

SMOKE ALARMS: A SOUND YOU CAN LIVE WITH

This is the 2010 National Theme for Fire Prevention Week, October 3 - 9. It's a fact: Smoke alarms can cut your risk of dying in a home fire in half! When it comes to fire safety, there's nothing more important than early notification of the least amount of smoke in the beginning stages of a home fire. However, not having the smoke detector working is like not having one at all. Smoke alarm failure is usually because the batteries are missing, dead, or disconnected. Forty percent of home fire deaths happen in homes with no smoke alarms. Another 23% happen in homes with smoke alarms that do not work. Remember two key rules to follow which will keep your smoke detectors working the way they should:

1. Test your detectors at least once per month; it only takes two seconds.
2. Change the battery in your detectors at least twice per year. (I suggest changing your smoke detector batteries when you move your clocks in the Spring and Fall.)

The smoke alarm unit itself should be replaced every ten years or sooner if they don't respond to monthly tests with a fresh battery. It's sad to think that for a \$5.00 investment, a life could have been saved. The Negaunee City and Township Fire Departments are committed to educating the importance of fire safety to your children in the Negaunee Schools. We will do whatever we can to reduce the number of home fire deaths, but we will need help from all of you to do it! Please test your detectors; it's a sound we can all live with. For more information on fire safety and smoke detectors, you can contact your local fire department or go online to the NFPA (National Fire Protection Agency), at www.nfpa.org or www.sparky.org.

All second graders will receive training on the Fire Safety House (or Smoke House) as the kids call it. This unique fire training, which is sponsored by the fire departments in Negaunee Township and City, will give the children a "hands on" look at how to quickly and safely escape a home fire. The program starts with a short briefing and instruction on what they are about to partake in, followed by a short video on the ABC's of fire safety. The importance of smoke detectors in the home for early warning will be demonstrated and then the students will actually crawl out of the Safety House that will be completely filled with a "safe" smoke. This once-a-year program is one that every second grader should not miss. Permission slips must be returned to school by the day of the demonstration. The dates for the safety house will be Wednesday, October 6, Thursday, October 7, and Monday, October 11.
