Student Pick Up

No student will be allowed to leave school prior to dismissal time without a written request signed by the parent or the parents coming to school to request the release. **Parents must sign students out in the office. Students will be called to the office via PA announcement when their ride is at school.** No student will be released to a person other than the custodial parent(s) without written permission signed by the custodial parent(s) or guardian.

FLU SEASON IS HERE!

Here are a few tips to stay healthy:

- o Take the time to get the flu vaccination.
- o Cover your nose and mouth when you cough and sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash when done.
- o Wash your hands often with soap and water.
- o Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- o Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- o If you do get the flu, stay home and limit contact with others to keep from infecting them.
- o Get plenty of rest, eat well-balanced nutritious meals and drink plenty of fluids.

Signs and symptoms of the Flu:

The flu typically presents with sudden onset of a high fever, chills, headache, extreme tiredness, dry cough, sore throat, severe body aches, and possibly vomiting.

How the Flu spreads:

The flu spreads from person to person in respiratory drops via cough or sneeze. Touching something with the virus, then touching the eyes or nose, may also cause a person to get infected. The flu can be spread one day before symptoms occur and up to five days after getting sick. The best way to prevent the spread is to get vaccinated. The Marquette County Health Dept. is hosting Flu Shot Clinics. You can contact them at 475-7844 or www.mqthealth.org for dates and times. You may also contact your family physician on how/when to become vaccinated.

When to stay home:

- o Fever of 100 degrees or higher; students should be fever-free off Tylenol for 24 hours before returning to school.
- o Recurrent diarrhea or vomiting/significant nausea.
- o Sore throat, particularly with swollen glands.
- o Significant headache or stomachache.
- o Repeated symptoms such as coughing or sneezing, which are likely to spread germs.
- o Contagious skin/eye infection such as impetigo or pink eye. Should be on antibiotic for 24 hours before returning to school.
