"Trick or Treat for UNICEF" is celebrating its 60th anniversary this year, a project that has generated nearly \$160,000,000 to help children throughout the world obtain health care, education, clean water and food.



The elementary students in Negaunee have been participating in this project since 1974 and have raised and donated \$22,539.65! This year, despite the wind and rain, the Lakeview students collected \$700. Mr. Collins' class won the pumpkin trophy, with \$132.48, Mrs. Belanger's class, \$98.56, Mrs. Kytta's class, \$79.63, Mrs. Finkbeiner's class, \$75.45, Mrs. Kus' class, \$46.08, Mrs. Schneider's class, \$43.86, Mrs. Beacco's class, \$42.02 and Mrs. Stetson's class, \$37.88. Other classes in the school collected a combined total of \$144.04, making a grand total of \$700.

NPS Title VII/Indian Education Program News

Negaunee Public Schools has a program called Title VII, Indian Education Program. It is funded under a federal grant, offered to students in our district with Native American heritage. This program has been here since the middle 80's. **The district must have completed 506 forms on file to apply for this formula grant.**

Each school district (that applies), has their own separate program. Our program consists of an after-school homework program and in-school tutoring for Native students and their peers at the elementary and middle school levels.

If your child is a member of a tribe or has Indian ancestry, and is enrolled in Negaunee Public Schools, Pre-school through Grade 12, please contact your child's school for a Title VII Student Eligibility Certification Form 506. Complete it and return it to the school office.
