

FREE Airplane Flights for Students Ages 8 through 17
Dates: May 16, June 20, July 18, August 15, September 19 and October 17

Free airplane flights will be available for young people from ages 8 through 17 **Saturday, April 24**, and again on **Saturday, June 12**. The flights last 20 minutes and are offered as a one-time experience as a part of the Experimental Aircraft Association's Young Eagles Program.

On both dates, registration will take place from 9:30 a.m. - 12:00 noon at Sawyer Airport's General Aviation Terminal, about two miles south of the passenger terminal. Parents or legal guardians must sign a permission form before the flight. *Please note that relatives are not legal guardians.*

Flights may be canceled due to unfavorable weather conditions. In case of cancellation, the event will be rescheduled at the same time on the following day (Sunday, April 25 or June 13.) For information call (906) 361-6196.
