VISITORS, PLEASE.



- Stop in the office;
- Sign in on the gold-colored sheet;
- Wear a visitor tag in a visible location;
- Return to the office;
- Sign out on the gold-colored sheet;
- Return the visitor tag.

If you are not wearing a visitor's tag, it is the responsibility of all staff members to request that you return to the office to follow the above procedure before delivering your item or visiting your child.

Questions & Answers:

- Q: If I am only running quickly to my child's classroom do I need to sign in?**
A: Yes, even if you are just quickly dropping off an item (gloves, hat, homework, etc.) to your child, you must check in and out at the office during regular school hours.
- Q: Do I have to sign in to bring lunch money to my child?**
A: If you are coming to school anytime **before** the start (9:00 a.m.) or **after** the end of the school day (3:39 p.m.), you DO NOT need to sign in. If you are bringing lunch money after the start of the school day, you must sign in at the office.
- Q: Do I wear a visitor pass for helping with a classroom activity?**
A: If you are helping with a classroom activity, then our hope is that you are a S.H.I.N.E. volunteer, as this is how we track all of our volunteer efforts. (Please see Mrs. Faust if you would like to volunteer.) If you are not a S.H.I.N.E. volunteer, you must follow the above procedure to obtain a visitors tag.
- Q: Do I need to sign in for classroom party days?**
A: Yes, please follow sign-in procedures on all days, unless posted differently, as you enter the building.
- Q: Can grandparents still attend lunch with my child?**
A: Absolutely. We encourage participation in your child's education. While visiting for lunch, the sign in/out procedure should be followed and a visitor tag must be worn.
- Q: Do I need to sign in for Christmas concerts or awards ceremonies?**
A: No you do not. Signs indicating this will be posted on those days.
