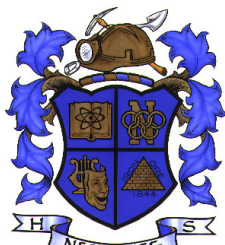

THE COMMUNITY

Negaunee High School is located in Negaunee, Michigan which has a population of 4,612. The name Negaunee comes from a Native American word nigani (Ojibwa tribe) meaning "foremost, in advance, leading". Negaunee was incorporated as a town in 1865 after the Jackson Mine was established to mine the ore in the area. Mining is still one of the primary professions in the Negaunee area today.

MISSION STATEMENT

The primary purpose of our school is teaching and learning. It is our responsibility to develop the intellectual, vocational, physical, creative, cultural, and social capabilities of all our students to their maximum potential. Our schools belong to the people of our community, and we further realize that productive schools are built on partnerships of citizens, parents, and staff.

THE SCHOOL

Negaunee High School is a four-year high school enrolling 441 students in grades nine through twelve. Partnering with Northern Michigan University, our school is fully invested in a Middle College program, which allows our students to accumulate college credits in Career and Technical Education fields. The high school was opened in 1986 in a unique renovation of an abandoned underground mine. Few would recognize the former Mather B Mining site. In 2009, the District constructed a state-of-the-art auditorium, allowing our students and community members to showcase their talents. Tennis courts were constructed on the north side of the building in 2014. Currently, a brand new 20,000 square foot practice facility is being constructed two blocks from the school, which our high school athletes and band members will use regularly.

GRADUATION REQUIRMENTS

Negaunee High School offers a 2-semester year. Classes meet each day for 50 minutes with a 7-period day. Any course successfully completed for one semester is given one-half credit (.5). Any course successfully completed for the entire year is given one full credit (1.0). Credit is granted on a semester basis for all courses; that is, a student is required to successfully complete a minimum of one semester to receive credit.

Graduation from Negaunee High School requires the successful completion of twenty-two (22) credits and the Michigan Merit Exam Curriculum standards.

Graduation requirements include:

4 credits of English	½ credit of Physical Education
4 credits of Math	½ credit of Computers
3 credits of Social Studies	1 credit of Visual/Performing/Applied Arts
3 credits of Science	3.5 credits of Electives
½ credit of Health	2 credits of Foreign Language*

*Please note that some students may make substitutions to this requirement based on career goals.
